Main aims of Life:Moving

- CORRECT misrepresentation/ stereotypes
- CONNECT us, meaningfully, to others' experience



6 films, 6 participants











Specific Research questions

- What are the most pressing ethical concerns for the representation and sharing of the experience of the terminally ill and their families?
- What are the most effective digital tools for this, and for 'empowering' the terminally ill in and through the process, for immediate and enduring use?

(culturally specific) Findings:

- Therapeutic: for participants but also for their loved ones and audiences
- Empowering: for participants and loved ones.
- · Legacy: creates enduring memories/memorial
- Socio-political: corrected misrepresentations and stereotypes; reveals the universality AND particularity of dying
- Medical/Clinical: reveals oft-hidden experiences of care, treatment and dying*
- Advocacy: invaluable tool for educating society about illness/palliative care and bringing about change
